

## Call for Research Posters for Virtual OncANP Conference

If you have something of value to share related to naturopathic oncology, we want to hear from you! Whether you have completed primary research, written a review, developed a clinical protocol, or seen an exceptional clinical response, we invite you to share your knowledge.

We are seeking submissions related to:

- Preclinical research (i.e. animal or in vitro)
- Case reports and/or case series
- Observational clinical studies
- Clinical trials
- Literature reviews and summaries
- Standardized clinic protocols
- Group programs of care
- Use of diagnostic tools and tests
- Models of care

**Context:** Posters are widely used in the academic community at conferences as a means of sharing research. This is an additional way of providing information to our attendees and allowing clinicians and researchers within our community to share their clinical experience and knowledge.

**Format:** As the conference is being held virtually, each poster will be presented via a prerecorded 3-minute video, and hosted along with a PDF of the poster on the OncANP member's site. Full details to come.

**Poster competition:** All posters accepted for presentation will be entered in a research poster competition! A panel of judges will select the top posters in a student/resident category and general category. Winners will be announced at the conference, details on prize to follow.

## **Submission guidelines:**

Please provide an abstract not to exceed 300 words in the following format:

<u>Title:</u> Short but descriptive

Authors: Include all those who contributed to design, writing, and content

<u>Background or introduction:</u> Why is this information relevant? What is the background information that is needed for understanding and context? What are the objectives?

<u>Methods:</u> How was the data collected? What tools/tests were used? What was the timing? If a research study what done, what design was used? What was the intervention?

<u>Results:</u> What are the key findings?

<u>Conclusions:</u> What can you say that summarizes the information? What is clinically relevant? What questions remain? What additional research is needed?

**Note:** if the above described structure does not fit your topic/poster, please submit a narrative abstract not to exceed 300 words. Please include as many of the above components as is reasonable.

Conflict of interest information must be provided on the form in the indicated space.

Please indicate if the lead author on this poster/project is a student or resident in the space indicated so this project can be entered in the research poster competition in the correct category.

## Abstract review criteria:

Abstracts are reviewed by the research committee based on the following criteria:

- Adherence to the submission guidelines
- Quality of the research and abstract (including the title, background, methods, results, conclusions, spelling and grammar)
- Relevance to the field of naturopathic medicine/oncology
- Interest, appeal, and impact
